


# **CARING FOR YOUR PERCUSSION INSTRUMENT**



### PREPARING YOUR **DRUM PAD:**


- 1. Place your drum pad on a flat surface that is about the height of your waistline.
- 2. Make sure that the flat surface you've chosen is sturdy.
- 3. Make sure that the drum head is facing up.
- 4. The screws on the drum pad can be adjusted with the help of a parent/guardian by using a flat head or Phillips screwdriver to ensure the proper amount of tension in the drum head.





## **KO@HOME GUIDE: INSTRUMENT CARE**

#### **HOLDING YOUR DRUM STICKS:**



#### **MATCHED GRIP**

- 1. Lightly pinch each drum stick with your thumb and 1st finger at the gripping area. The tip should be facing away from you and the butt towards you.
- 2. Lightly wrap your remaining 3 fingers around each drum stick. These fingers will gently support your grip of the drum sticks and will be a part of the "stroke".

## WHAT NOT TO DO WITH YOUR PERCUSSION INSTRUMENT:

- Place your instrument on the floor.
- Play your instrument while it is on a surface that is not flat or sturdy.
- Swing around your drum sticks or drum pad.
- Leave your instrument in the car or other place where it can be stolen.
- Place any object on top of the <u>drum pad</u>.
- Use your drum sticks on anything besides your drum pad.
